# Shropshire Ornithological Society Shropshire Bird Report 1955 – unpublished MS

#### MUTE SWAN 1955

A census organised by the British Trust for Ornithology was taken during the breeding season.

The total number of Swans counted in Shropshire was 327, consisting of 73 breeding pairs; 19 non-breeding pairs; 69 individual bifds; and 4 herds totalling 74 birds, of which the largest was 46 birds on the Severn at Shrewsbury.

Of the total of 327 birds, 72% were on "stationary" waters (canals, meres, lakes etc.) and 28% were on "flowing" waters (rivers and streams).

Taking into account waters not covered and which were known to contain Swans, it was estimated that another 5% could be added, bringing the total population to approximately 350, including 80 breeding pairs.

A pair with fourteen cygnets was seen at Longden Coleham June 9th (L.C.L.)
