Forrest, H.E. 1 June 1918 p.2-3. *Bitterns in the West*.

"Bitterns in the West.- During January and February, two or three Bitterns were seen – not shot! – in the west of Anglesey; while another of these fine birds was shot on the Montgomery border of Shropshire. – H.E. FORREST."

Bitterns have been met with in any parts of the country during the winter. Numbers have been shot, despite the Protection Acts. It is indeed a pleasure to be able to record that 'two or here have been seen – not short!'. – R.F.

Pitt, F. 1 October 1918 p.335. Pied Redwing.

"On March 18th I saw near Bridgnorth a Pied Redwing, a species which is much less liable to such variation than either the Thrush or Blackbird. It was one of a large and very wild flock, but it appeared to have a white tail and primaries. It was very noticeable when on the wing. (Miss) Frances Pitt."
